# From The Pastor

Writing about ethics, the Greek philosopher Aristotle (384–322 BC) said

"As it is not one swallow or a fine day that makes a spring, so it is not one day or a short time that makes a man blessed and happy ... These virtues are formed in man by his doing the right actions."

William James Durant (1885–1981) American writer, historian, and philosopher put it more succinctly. He said,

"We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, then, is not an act, but a habit."

What are important habits for Christians? What could be part of our regular routine that would help us in our Christian journey? This could be a long list. But like a healthy diet, moderate exercise, and rest are good for the body, here are a few things that are especially good for our souls.

1) Prayer. I think Jesus intended the Lord's Prayer to be a daily prayer. Daily we are called to honor God, submit to God, seek God's will, his help, his forgiveness. Daily prayer is an act of humility, recognizing that we do not have all the answers, nor are we strong enough on our own. We need God. Daily prayer is also a means to peace. Peter wrote, "cast your cares upon the Lord, who cares for you." (1 Peter 5:7)

"In the morning, O Lord, You will hear my voice." **Psalm 5:3** 

2) Studying the Bible. Trying to understand Christianity without reading the Bible would be like trying to understand US History without reading the Constitution. The 67 books of the Bible represent the record of the ongoing story of God's dealings with humanity. The heart of the story is in the four gospels, where we read of the "Word, become flesh." If you want to know what Jesus believed, read what he said. If you want to grow as a disciple, follow what he said.

"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." Psalm 119:105

3) Participating in a Christian Community. The Apostle Paul described the church as a body in which the parts all need each other. In this wonderful analogy, it is clear that not only do we need the larger Christian community, but the community also needs us. We are better together.

Praying, studying, and worshiping together are all parts of a healthy Christian diet. Eat well in 2023.

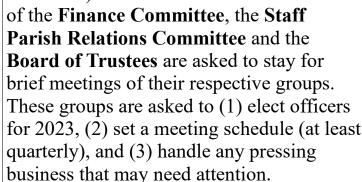
