From The Pastor

I have been asked several times, "John, what's going on with the United Methodist Church?" Well, I've heard it described as a "slow motion split."

One side, known as the "Progressives" is supported by most of the United Methodist Bishops. They are pushing for a big tent, all-inclusive church; a church for gays and straights, conservatives and liberals. So the official theme of the 2022 North Georgia Annual Conference was "A Place for You at The Table." Specifically, Progressives advocate for the removal of homosexual prohibitions from our Book of Discipline and would like to see these paragraphs deleted.

¶ 304.3 The practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching. Therefore self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be certified as candidates, ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in The United Methodist Church

¶ 341.6 Ceremonies that celebrate homosexual unions shall not be conducted by our ministers and shall not be conducted in our churches.

On the other side, there is a group known as "Traditionalists." They believe that all people have sacred worth and that all are welcome in church. But they urge the keeping of the above paragraphs in the Book of Discipline. They believe that United Methodists should hold fast to the traditional beliefs and understanding of the Bible.

The battleground for much of the conflict has been at the General Conference (GC). This group normally meets every four years with delegates from around the world. The GC makes policy for the whole UMC and has the authority to affirm or change church positions. The last regular meeting of the GC was in 2016, during which the traditional values were affirmed. There was a Called Special Session of the GC in 2019, in which the bishops pushed for an all-inclusive "One Church Plan." This was voted down, and the traditional values of the church reaffirmed.

Also at the 2019 Special Session, a temporary provision was added to the Discipline, known as ¶ 2553. It allows churches to leave the denomination and keep their property, if they follow certain stipulations, including a 2/3 vote of professing members present at a called Church Conference, payment of two years apportionments and payment of their portion of any unfunded pension liabilities. Those leaving are called "disaffiliating." According to the 2019 Special Session of the GC, the ¶ 2553 exit provisions expire at the end of 2023.

In preparing for the 2020 General Conference, there was legislation created and supported by many Progressive and Traditional leaders called the "Protocol for Separation." This would have guided a peaceful division of the church. However, due to the Covid closures, the 2020 General Conference was postponed until 2022, and then this meeting was also postponed. The General Conference is not

expected to meet again until 2024. In the meantime, many of the Progressive leaders have said they no longer approve of the Protocol.

So with the Protocol in doubt, and the expiration date coming up for ¶ 2553, several hundred UM churches across the US voted to disaffiliate this year. In the North Georgia Annual Conference 70 churches left, including 12 churches from our district. This was covered in newspapers in Atlanta and Augusta. And, since the ¶ 2553 provisions extend through 2023, it is expected that there will be another wave of disaffiliations in 2023. Many of those departing are joining a newly formed organization called the Global Methodist Church (https://globalmethodist.org).

That in brief, is as I understand it, is the state of the church.
