### From The Pastor

I was just looking at the calendar. Did you know that sunset on Monday night, March 6, starts Purim? This is the annual remembrance of the events from the Book of Esther. Set around 470 BC, Esther and the bulk of the Jewish population have been exiled to Persia where an adversary seeks to destroy them once and for all. This enemy even had the audacity to roll a dice, called a "pur", asking his god to give the date to attack the Jews. Now, strangely, GOD is not named in this book. But through the most amazing and unlikely series of "coincidences" the Jews are saved. The dice date became the deliverance date, still celebrated as Purim. The big picture is that life is not just a roll of the dice. God is real, and God is working behind the scenes, showing his love to his people. The Apostle Paul would later write:

And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose. (Romans 8:28, NKJV)

I read an article last week from an Asbury University Student named Madison Pierce. He was writing on his experience of the "movement of the Spirit of God" that began in a regular Chapel service on February 8, and became an ongoing weeks long, 24 hour, praise and worship event. (Google Asbury Revival to find numerous articles on this amazing event.) Madison identified himself as Generation Z (born after 1997). He said that this outpouring of God's Spirit has "given a tangible sense of peace for a generation with unprecedented anxiety; a restorative sense of belonging for a generation amidst an epidemic of loneliness; an authentic hope for a generation marked by depression." This revival is spreading to other campuses.

I think God is reminding Generation Z, and the rest of us, of His reality. He is real! Life is not an accident; neither are we, nor are we alone.

I'm reminded of a poem from Lon Woodrom, whom I heard speak at Asbury in 1980:

Who knows what God has done for us today; what wings of mercy lifted on our way; against what foes God's forces won before the busy day was done? Our hearts beat and we breathed, quite unaware that heaven stalked us. Life was there! Such good things happened – what if we were served by silent angels unobserved? We have not been alone upon the way; who knows what God has done for us this day?


#### FELLOWSHIP MEALS: BECAUSE FAMILIES EAT TOGETHER!
