From The Pastor

It is common in the month of March to read the Book of Esther. Here's the short version. While the Jews were still in exile in Persia, the Persian king, Ahasuerus, became displeased with his wife, and had her removed. Shortly afterward, feeling lonely, the king had a selection of beautiful young ladies gathered up and presented to him, from which he would choose the new queen. As it happened, he chose a young lady named Esther. Unbeknownst to the King, Esther was Jewish, in fact her real name is Hadassah, but we'll still call her Esther. After Esther was made queen, her uncle and advisor Mordecai, would come and sit in the palace courtyard, just to be near Esther and sometimes pass messages through the servants. On one occasion, this led to the King's life being saved. Mordecai overheard a plot to assassinate the king, passed the word to Esther, and the king was saved. The scribes added this event to the recorded history of his kingship.



About that time, the King promoted a villain named Haman as his second in command. Haman, a proud man, commanded for music to be played as he walked around the city. Everyone who heard the music and saw him must stop what they were doing, and bow to the ground. Really. Well one day, he walks through the courtyard, music plays, and everyone bows except Mordecai. Haman sees this, is angry, and on learning that Mordecai is Jewish, plans revenge not just on Mordecai, but on all the Jewish people in Persia. He sits with his friends, and they plot their action. Dice are rolled to pick the date of the coming destruction of the Jews. (The word for dice in Persian is "pur".) The order is brought to the King, and he unknowingly signed it.

Word gets out on this coming date for the Jewish annihilation. Mordecai hurries to the courtyard and gets word to the Queen. Esther agrees to speak on their behalf to the King, but it is forbidden for her to go and see him, unless called for. After a 3 day fast, she goes to see him anyway, risking her own death. The King receives Esther. "What can I do for you?" he asks. She simply invites him to dinner. Haman is also invited. The dinner is successful. The King asks again what he can do for Esther. She says, "Come back again tomorrow and I'll tell you."

Haman is overjoyed to be part of this, but after the first dinner he sees Mordecai again, who once again will not bow. In his anger, Haman commands a gallows to be built for Mordecai to be hung on the very next day. THAT night the king could not sleep. He asks for the history of his kingship to be read to him. In the morning the servant, still reading, comes to the point where Mordecai had saved the king's life. Just then Haman comes to see the king for permission to kill Mordecai. The king asks, what should be done to honor someone the king is pleased with? Haman, thinking it was him, lists several honors – put him in a king's robe, put him on the king's horse, give him a parade, with someone calling out praise for him. The King says, do all of this, leave none of it out, do it for Mordecai who saved my life.

Haman is taken aback, but does what he is commanded, then makes haste to the second dinner with the King and Queen. At this dinner, Esther reveals Haman's intention to kill her people. Haman is bound,

hung on his own gallows, and Mordecai given his estate and position. A new law is passed enabling the Jews to defend themselves, so they are spared from annihilation. The day that had been picked to destroy the Jews is still celebrated as a day they were victorious. This annual celebration is called Purim (named for the dice), and this year it is March 24 - 25.

• The big picture of the book of Esther is that God is ultimately in charge, and that God often works behind the scenes as He cares for His people. This was true for the Jews in Persia and is still true for God's people today.
